Like wise Alexander Meeay and Robert Meeay entered into Recogniz. the same time as in the Sum of Ten pounds Sterd each for the appearance of the asd George Meeay and to answer as asd and in the mean while he was to be of good behaviour No person Shewing any cause why the same Recognizances ought not to be discharged This Court here discharges the same ordered by the Court here that the asd George enter into Recognizance with Sureties for his appearance to the next Court

George Meeay comes into Court and acknowledges himselfe Indebted to his Lord Ship his heirs and Successors in the Sum of Twenty pounds Sterd to be Levied on his goods and Chattells Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if he do not make his personall appearance at the next Court to be held for said County and to answer unto all Suits Things as shall at the same Court be objected against him on his Lord Ships behalfe and that in the mean time he is to be of good behaviour wherewith he acknowledges himselfe Content

Like wise came into Court Robert Meeay and Roger Dix both of this County and acknowledged themselves Indebted to his Lord Ship his heirs and Successors in the Sum of Ten pounds Sterd each to be Levied on their goods and Chattells Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if the asd George Meeay do not appear and answer as asd and in the mean time he is to be of good behaviour wherewith they acknowledge themselves to be Content

His Recogniz taken at last Court for his appearance to this Court and now at this Court the asd William in his proper person appears to the same ordered by the Court here that his Recogniz and his Sureties Recogniz for his appearance be discharged.

Wm Usherwood asd his Recogniz taken the same time as in the Sum of ten pounds Sterd to be Levied on Conditionally that if he did not make his appearance at this Court to answer unto what should be objected against him on his Lord Ships behalfe and in the mean time he was to be of good behaviour and now at this Court no person Shewing any cause why the asd Recogniz ought not to be discharged This Court here discharges y same Recogniz

Like wise at the same time asd Charles Smith & Wm Dias entered into Recognizances in the Sum of five pounds Sterd each to be Levied on Conditionally that if he asd William Usherwood did not appear and answer as asd and in the Mean time he was to be of good behaviour and now at this Court no person Shewing any cause why the asd Recognizances should not be discharged This Court here discharges the same Recognizances

Mrs Lambert Wilmer one of his Lord Ships Justices of the Peace that a certain Margt Hussey proved before him that the asd Wm Usherwood was the person that begat her with Child which Child is now become as a Charge on this County and the asd Mary is since deceased ordered by the Court
