of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday in March next to satisfy unto  
William Frisby as well the summe of twelve hundred pounds of tobacco —  
which was condemned in the hands of the afo<sup>r</sup> George Sanders as the Rights  
and Credits of a certaine John Moore of Kent County Weaver al<sup>d</sup> D<sup>r</sup> John Moore  
of said County poor before the Justices of our said Court on the Twentieth day  
of March anno<sup>r</sup> Domini One Thousand Seven hundred and Seventeen  
whereof the afo<sup>r</sup> George Sanders was bound as appears upon Record as  
also forty six pounds of tobacco left lying on this prompt haire of sale not  
at your perill and hazard you then and there affirme<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Frisby Nathaniel  
Hynson Gent<sup>r</sup> chief Justice of our said Court this Twenty second day of November  
in the fourth year of his Lordships Dominion A<sup>r</sup> 1718 Dom 1718

of Chester in said County to answer unto William Frisby late Sheriff of Kent  
County of a sum of 1000 pounds upon the Case and that he have then and there the  
said Walter King delivered near Court House the Seventeenth day of March  
the same year last mentioned the day of return of said writ come Simon  
Wilmer Gent<sup>r</sup> High Sheriff of said County and made return thereof in these  
words thereon endorsed as paid by Corpus of Simon Wilmer therf  
and now at the said Court the afo<sup>r</sup> debt being called and the afo<sup>r</sup> Sir Thomas  
Barne his atty pray that the said debt might give speciall bail  
to the defendant whiche was granted and that he be kept in safe custody by  
the Sheriff of said County whiche he shall give speciall bail as afo<sup>r</sup>  
after to him to be paid and William Elliott both of said County here in  
Court comitt<sup>r</sup> and they jointly and severally acknowledge themselves  
speciall bail in the afo<sup>r</sup> debt and they and either of them do undertake the  
payment of the Damages in the sum afo<sup>r</sup> and of thenceon accruing of it
