Commanded it was to the Sheriff of Kent County the twenty second day of November in the forty year of his said Majestys Dominion &c. That he take Edward Rogers of Kent County Planter and did Edward Rogers of Kent County Planter if he should be found

in his bailiwick and him safe keep so that he have his body before his said Lord Majestys Justices of the next Court to be held at our Court house in the Town of Rochester in said County to answer unto Margret Browne executrix of last will and Testament of Peregrine Browne late of London Merch deceased of a plea that he render to her the sume of four thousand three hundred and sixty pounds of every way well conditioned Tobacco in each pipe of value of forty three pounds Sterling money which from her he unjustly detains &c. And that he have them and there the said writ &c. All which said writ Court by the seventeenth day of March the same year last mentioned the day of return of said writ came Simon Wilmore Gent Justice of said County & made return thereof in these words thereon enclosed as folo viz. Cap. Corpus & Simon Wilmore Just.

AND a declaration being read when said writ issued forth and a Copy thereof served therewith according to Act of Assembly in such cases made was as folo viz. Kent County & Edward Rogers of Kent County Planter and did Edward Rogers of Kent County Planter was summoned to answer unto Margret Browne executrix of last will and Testament of Peregrine Browne late of London Merch. deceased of a plea that he render to her the sume of four thousand three hundred and sixty pounds of every way well conditioned Tobacco in each pipe of value of forty three pounds Sterling money which from her he unjustly detains &c. And whereupon the said Margret by Thomas Bonve her atty saith that whereas the said Edward the first day of April in the year of our Lord Christ sixteen hundred & nine at Spauls parish in Kent County within the Jurisdiction of this Court by his certain writing obligatory which the said Edward sealed with his Seal & as his deed delivered here into Court brought the date whereof is the same day and year aforesaid granted himselfe holder and firmly bounden to the said Peregrine for his life time in
