Robert Ungle & Thomas Hatterny Plaintiffs
Maryland Kent County Thomas Hatterny late of
Kent County Planter was attached to enjoin unto Robt
Ungle of plea of trespass on the Case and whereupon
the said ptt. by John Johnson his atty complains

that whereas the said ptt. & Deft. by nine tenth day of March in the Year
of our Lord one Thousand Seven hundred & Sixteen at the parish of St
pauls in the County aforesaid & within the Jurisdiction of this Court between them
several accounts & of and concerning divers Sums of money to the said
ptt. by y^e said Deft. before that time due & then as arrears and upon
the Judgment the said Deft. was found in arrears towards the said
ptt. in ten pounds Seven Shillings & two pence Current money of this
Province and being so indebted the said Deft. in Consideration thereof
did upon himselfe assume & to the said ptt. then & there faithfully promised
that he y^e Deft. the Sum of ten pounds Seven Shillings & two pence
to y^e said ptt. when he should be therunto required would well & truly pay
& Content Nevertheless the said Deft. his promise & assumption of his former
as made little minding or regarding but plotting & fraudulently intending
the said ptt. in this behalf wastfully & subtilly to deceive & defraud the
said ten pounds Seven Shillings & two pence to the said ptt. hath not
paid all this to do the same of said Deft. by the Twentieth day of March in
the Year aforesaid at the parish County & Jurisdiction aforesaid by the Deft. hath been thereto
required but to pay y^e same hath therunto refused & still doth refuse wherefore
he says he is worse & hath damage to the Value of twenty pounds Current money
& thereupon he brings Suite &c — John Johnson ptt. pro. J. Doe

And the said Deft. in his proper person appeared to the above Quon and
prayed liberty thereof to impare thereto and to answer at next Court which was
granted the same day was given the ptt. aforesaid.

At which said next Court viz. this Twentieth day of March Annoque
Domini One Thousand Seven hundred and Seventeen came the aforesaid Deft. by
his said Atty. and the said Deft. in his proper person and said that he
cannot gain say the Quon aforesaid of him the said ptt. nor did that he is indebted
the aforesaid Sum of ten pounds Seven Shillings and two pence Current money
as a Good declared for and is willing that Judgment should be entered for the
same and Cost thereon accruing. Therefore it is ordered by the Court here
viz. this same day last mentioned that the aforesaid Robert Ungle do
sue against the said Deft. Thomas Hatterny as well the aforesaid
of ten pounds Seven Shillings and two pence Current money Damages as also
the Sum of two hundred Eighty Six pounds & Six pence Cost by y^e aforesaid about his
Suite in this behalf awarded and by the Court here of his aforesaid adjudged and the
said Deft. in mercy
