

June Court 1719

Said Deft. by Thomas Borne his attorney comes and defends the force and injury when sd. and saith that the ap^{pl} Wm Aiton ap^d against him the said Deft to have or maintaine ought not because he saith that he hath fully Administered all the goods and Chattells which were of the ap^d Sarah Davis the Intestate at the time of her death and that he the said Deft hath noe goods nor Chattells which were of the ap^d Intestate at the time of her death in his hands to be administered nor had the said Deft any goods or Chattells of the said Intestate on the day of the Impetration of the original writ of the ap^{pl} nor ever after, and this he is ready to verify wherefore he prayes judgment of the ap^{pl} his action ap^d ag^t the said Deft to have and maintaine ought not.

AND the ap^d Roger Sarramore for that the ap^d Wm Frisby by his plea ap^d doth deny but that the Quompt ap^d lately heremite Court brought is just and true and as yet unpaid and no part satisfied more than what is therein mentioned and for that the ap^d Roger Sarramore cannot deny but that the said Deft Wm Frisby hath not nor at the day of the Impetration of the original writ of the said ap^{pl} nor ever after nor heretofore had not any of the goods or Chattells which were of the ap^d Intestate at the time of her death in his hands to be administered prayes judgment for his Damages ap^d as to the time of Three thousand one hundred eighty three pounds of Tobacco by him above demanded of the goods and Chattells which were of the ap^d Intestate at the time of her death and which to the hands of the ap^d William hereafter shall come to be administered. Therefore it is Considered by the Justices here the 19 day of June Anno Dom 1719 ap^d that the ap^d Roger Sarramore shall recover against the said William Frisby as Dam^{ap} ap^d as well the ap^d sume of three thousand one hundred eighty & three pounds of Tobacco Damages ap^d of the goods and Chattells which were of the ap^d Sarah Davis the Intestate at the time of her death and which shall hereafter come to the hands of the ap^d William Frisby to Administer And the ap^d Wm Frisby in Mercy
