And now at this Court to viz. the 18<sup>th</sup> day of August Anno Domini  
1719 Came the ass George Macey and in his proper person appd.  
to the ass Judgment and defends the force and injury when v.  
and saith that he cannot gainsay the Judgment as ass but that  
he is guilty of committing fornication as ass and thereupon  
submits to the Court on the same Therefore it is ORDERED  
By the Court here viz. the 19<sup>th</sup> day of August ass that the ass George  
Macey pay the sume of thirty Shill. Current money his fine according  
to Act of assembly in such Cases made and provided for his offense of  
committing fornication ass as ass Confessed as also the sume of one  
hundred and Ninety and Nine pounds of Tobacco Cost arising on the  
premisses ass

ordered that the said ass be delivered the Sheriff of said County w.  
was accordingly done

His Lordship The ass Joseph at last Court entered into Recognizance  
for his appearance to this Court and in his  
proper person appears to the same ordered by  
Joseph Wright the Court here that his Recognizance be  
discharged as also his Sureties for his appearance  
Joseph Wright ass entered into Recognizance at the time ass in the  
sume of twenty pounds Sterling to be Recognized Conditionally that if  
he did not make his personally appearance at this present Court  
and to answer unto a certain Judgment found against him for  
stealing of Tob. from a certain Richard Davis. and that in the  
mean time he was to be of good Behaviour and no person  
showing any cause to the contrary why the same should not be  
discharged the Court here discharges the said  
Francis Meeks and Thomas Winstanley at last Court each entered  
into
