 as himself prosecutes to have and exact of the said Deft for the said Lord
 proprietor and the said James Harris the said Two thousand pounds of
 Merchantable Tobacco of the said value of twenty pounds Sterling
 Nevertheless the said Deft. altho afterwards by the fifth day of November
 in the year of our Lord Christ One thousand Seven hundred and Seoven-
 teen and often after at the parish County and jurisdiction aforesaid was
 therewith required the said Two thousand pounds of Tobacco to the Said
 Lord proprietor or the said James Harris who as well for the Said Lord
 proprietor and himself prosecutes or to any of them hath not paid. But
 that to the Said Lord proprietor or to the said James Harris who prosecutes
 as aforesaid to pay hitherto hath denyed and still doth deny and unjustly
 detain to the Damage of him the Said James Harris forty pounds
 Sterling who as well for the Said Lord proprietor as for himself
