

Saith that he knows not of any Commerce or dealing by the Said Sarah Jewers with the Said Negro Tom but afterwards declares that he hath seen the Said Negro at the Said Sarah Jewers house and that he hath Carried Wheat and Corne for the Said Sarah Jewers to the Mill and that he hath fetcht the same againe from the Mill. It is demanded whether only wheat was carryd there, or that was left there for her use by other persons to the best of his knowledge, he does bring more from the Mill than he Carryd he answers he cannot tell saying that he did not measure the same when it came home And saith that he hath brought Corne and wheat from the Mill as was left there by other persons for her use that the Said Sarah Jewers delivered Syder for the same and being asked how know of Corne & wheat to be left there at the Mill for her, answers that two persons told him of it here at last Court that they told him they would Swear it. Demanded that when Jewellers lived with M^r Jewers if he know any thing of part of a loaf bread that was brought there from Negro Tom to M^r Jewers answers he knows nothing of it.

Demanded if knows any thing of Syder was delivered the Negro Tom doth not Rember any thing about it

Demanded if knows any thing about the Negro being at M^r Jewers when W^m Trulock and Sappage was there. Answers that he doth Rember about the time the Mill Dam was finished he being down at the Mill and going down to the dam, told them if they would go up to M^r Jewers and he could get it he would give them some Syder and he came to the house he did get some Syder of her and gave it them after some time that they had y^e Syder to drink the said William Trulock and Sappage came into the house. Saith he did bid one of the boys go away. Demanded if Negro Tom ever delivered him any corne or wheat. Saith that he hath had Corne and wheat Meale of the Said Negro Tom for the Said Sarah Jewers use.
