Whereas there being goods & Chattells that was feloniously Stolen by Henry Monk from Coll^d Nathⁿ Hyson the sd all things being enumerated in a certain Indent^r by the said Henry and all the sd Goods are to be taken care of by the Sheriff of sd County until the next Court except a Hatt which is not now here

It is Ordn^d That the said Henry entered into recogn^{ce} before M^r Mich^l Muller one of his Lordships Justices of the peace for said County which is as follow^s:
 Henry Monk of the said County planter comes before me the one of his Lordships Justices of the peace for the sd County and acknowledges himselfe justly indebted to his Lordship his heirs and Successors in the Summe of Twenty p^{cs} Sterling money of Great Brittain to be Levied on his goods and Chattells Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if he does not make his personall appearance at our next County Court to be holden the third Tuesday in November next and there stay and abide to answer unto all such things as shall be objected against him on his Lordships behalf and of the mean to be of his good behaviour wherunto he is Content

William Mackey and Thomas Rush as Sureties in the Summe of 10^l Sterling each to be Levied on their Goods and Chattells Lands and Tenements Conditionally that the said Henry Monk doth not make
