In me Sir William Thier

Whereupon at the prayer of the ptt by David Maubride her atty the Deft is adjudged to give special baile to the aucton as and that the Sheriff of Kent County keep the said Deft in Custody until he shall give special baile as aforesaid thereupon Robert Green of said County planter undertakes for the said Peter Green that in case the said Martha Smith executrix as aforesaid shall recover judgment in the plea as against the said Peter Green or that by the said Peter Green shall be therem Convent that then the said Peter Green shall pay the Condemnation of the Court thereupon or render his body to the Custody of the Sheriff of said County in satisfaction thereof or that the said Robert Green will do it for him

And the aforesaid Deft by Thomas Downe his atty comes and defends the force and injury &c. And saving to himselfe all manner of exceptions and Advantages as well to the ptt. as to the Deft of the said ptt prays liberty thereof to impare thereto and to answer at next Court which was granted the same day is given the ptt. also.
