Foreman John Reed who being duly Voted tryd and Sworn to say the truth in the premises upon their oath do say that the said John Hadden is not guilty as he stands indicted Therefore it is considered

by the Justice here to wit the 18th day of March Anno Dom 1719 afo that the said John Hadden as to the afo Inditment go thore of without day and that he be thore from acquitted and that he pay the fees accruing on the premises to the officers of this Court

amounting to the sume of seven hundred thirty one pounds of 100th ordered by the Court here that the said John Hadden go to his masters service and that his Master at the expiration of his time of service be delivered up to the Court
