Laughlin Plim Richard West and Daniel Cooley all of this County here present in Court in their proper persons they & every of them acknowledge themselves indebted to his Lord Ship the Lord Proprietarie of this Province his heirs and Assignors in the sume of one thousand pounds of Tobacco to be levied on their goods and Chattels Lands & Tenements Conditionally that if the ap Laughlin Plim shall not pay to his Lord Ship his heirs and Assignors the sume of five hundred pounds of Tobacco for his keeping a publick house of Entertainment or Ordinary at his house in the County ap as also they and every of them do acknowledge themselves indebted to his said Lord Ship his heirs and Assignors in the sume of twenty pounds Sterling to be levied on their goods & Chattels Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if the ap Laughlin Plim in his said house of Entertainment or ordinary shall entertain any freeman or loose person in his house above twenty four hours unless such person or persons are capable of giving a break for a delegate in said County or be by him retained as a Servant to here with they acknowledge themselves to be Content
