Michael Layell and his wife Thomas Windall Anne Windall (Christop. Hall Peter Cole Joseph Butler Benjamin Butler and George Morphett. Sworn as witnesses to the Grand Jury

John Beck complains that Josiah Crouch and that the said County the peace hath broken ordered by the Court that the Sheriff of said County bring the said Crouch before this Court to answer the same the same appears in Court and ordered to give Security for his appearance to Court and good behaviour in the meantime and especially to John Beck

The said Josiah Crouch acknowledges himself indebted to his said Ship his heirs & assigns in the sum of five pounds Sterd to be levied on his goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if the said Josiah Crouch shall not make his personall appearance at the next Court to be held for said County to answer unto what shall be objected against him on his said Ship's behalf and in the meantime to be of good behaviour and especially to John Beck wherewith he acknowledges himself content

John Beck junior and Joseph Corritt both of said County comes into Court and acknowledges themselves indebted to his Lordship his heirs and assigns in the sum of five pounds Sterd Cash to be levied Conditionally that if the said Josiah Crouch shall not appear and answer as aforesaid that he be of good behaviour as aforesaid wherewith they acknowledge themselves content

Claudius Rogers a poor man appears to this Court to be an object of Charity on which this Court adjudges him to be exempted from paying of Levy

Court adjourns till tomorrow morning eight Clock
