David Maubrice a^d his Recogniz^e taken before the a^d Justice on the twenty first day of March last in the Summ of forty pounds Sterl^d money to be Levied on his Good & Challes Lands and Tenem^t. Conditionally that if he did not make his personal appearance at the then next County Court to be held for said County to answer unto all such things as should be objected ag^t him on behalfe of his Petition & in the meantime he was to be of good Behaviour and especially to Thomas Bonne and now at this Court in person shewing any cause to the Contrary why the Recogniz^e should not be discharged this Court here discharges the Same.

Simon Wilmer and Samuel Wicks at the same time a^d entered into Recogniz^e and in the Summ of twenty pounds Sterl^d each to be levied on^d. Conditionally that if the a^d David Maubrice should not appear and answer as a^d and that he the said David Maubrice be of good Behaviour as a^d this Court here discharges the Same Recogniz^eances each of them.

The Grand Jury Returns and being called over appears and returns to the Court the following presentm^t viz^t

Ag^t Elizabeth Turner of Lower South. 100 s. a fine hundred for having a base born Child their being not sufficient Evidences on which the Court was the Same.

Also ag^t David Ford of Upper South. 100 s. a fine hundred for having a Mare Calt. supposed to belong to a Mare of John Rogers neck hundred for having a base born Child.

Also ag^t Benjamin Griffin and Martha Bryan of Worton hundred for Adultery.

Also ag^t Ann Sanders Servant of William Ringold of Lank. 100 s. a fine hundred for having a base born Child.

Also ag^t John Bateman for an Assault and on Sarah Michelson The Grand Jury consents that serm^t notwithstanding Justice may be allowed
