And the a^s James Rea in his proper person comes and defends the force & Injury when &c. and pray leave to imparle hereunto until next Court and he hath it and the same day is given to the a^s p^t also.

At which next Court viz. the 8th day of March anno Domini 1720 comes again as well the a^s p^t by his a^s Attorney as the a^s p^t in his proper person and the a^s p^t prays farther leave to imparle hereunto until next Court and he hath it and the same day is given to the a^s p^t also.

At which next Court viz. the 25th day of June anno Domini 1720 comes again as well the a^s p^t by his a^s Attorney as the a^s p^t in his proper person the a^s p^t having filed no plea to the a^s p^t on which the Court gives Rule to the a^s p^t to file a plea to the a^s p^t by two a Clock in the afternoon the same day last mentioned but no plea being put in according to the Rule a^s p^t but the a^s p^t makes default whereby the a^s p^t remains against the a^s p^t without further defence: Therefore it is considered by the Justices here the 28th day of July anno Domini 1720 that the a^s William Frisby Recover against the a^s James Rea as well the Summ of one thousand nine hundred and thirty two pounds of Tobacco his debt by occasion of the premises a^s as also the Summ of Two hundred and seventeen pounds of Tobacco
