And money which he unjustly Detaines. And whereupon the a<sup>p</sup> p<sup>t</sup> by Thomas Browne his attorney saith that whereas the a<sup>p</sup> Def. the sixteenth day of July in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and sixteen at Pa Pauls Parish in Kent County within the Jurisdiction of this Court by his Claim writting Obligatory which he the a<sup>p</sup> Def. sealed with his Seal and as his deed delivered hereunto Court brought the date whereof is the same day year a<sup>p</sup> Granted himself holden and firmly bound unto the a<sup>p</sup> Michael Cutler in his life time as signor or certain attorney in the a<sup>p</sup> full and just Summ of one thousand three hundred and Sixty pounds of every way well Conditioned safe Tobacco Clear of all manner of Trash and ground leaves in well Seasoned Cask unto required yet the a<sup>p</sup> Def. altho often required the a<sup>p</sup> Summ of one thousand three hundred and Sixty pounds of Tobacco. To the a<sup>p</sup> Michael in his life time or to the a<sup>p</sup> Adam after the death of the a<sup>p</sup> Michael to whom Letters of Adm<sup>n</sup> of the a<sup>p</sup> Michael at the time of his death by Mathias Underwood Gent Deputy Commissary for Cecil County on the fourteenth day of July in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and nineteen in Cecil County a<sup>p</sup> were lawfully Granted both not paid, but that to the a<sup>p</sup> Michael in his life time and to the a<sup>p</sup> Adam after the death of the a<sup>p</sup> Michael he the a<sup>p</sup> Def. to render or pay altogether both deneyed and the same to the a<sup>p</sup> Adam to pay.
