

To have the *D. Timothy* in his life time and the *D. Def.* after the death of the said *Timothy* to whom Letters of Administration of all and singular the Goods and Chables Rights and Credits which were of the *Timothy* at the death of the said *Timothy* at the time of his death hath been lawfully granted to him the *Plt.* hath not paid altho to pay the same the *D. Timothy* in his lifetime viz. the Eleventh day of January in the Year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred & Sixteen and the *D. Def.* after the death of the *D. Timothy* viz. the tenth day of June in the Year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and Ninety at the parish County and Jurisdiction aforesaid by the aforesaid *Plt.* was thereunto required But they the said *Timothy* in his life time and the *D. Def.* after the death of the *D. Timothy* the sum of four hundred and Eighty four pounds of Tobacco to the *Plt.* to pay or Content they and every of them have denyed and altogether refused and the aforesaid *Plt.* to pay or Content hitherto hath denyed and still doth deny to the Damage of him the *Plt.* One thousand pounds of Silver Spanish and there upon he brings Suit &c.

Bonne et quod *pro. Doe. & Roe.*

And the aforesaid *Def.* by *David Macbide* his Attorney Comes and defends the force and Injury whereof and prays leave to implead there unto untill next Court and he hath it and the same day is given the *Plt.* also.

At which next Court viz. the 25th day of June anno Domini 1720 came as well the aforesaid *Plt.* by his aforesaid Attorney as the aforesaid *Def.* by his aforesaid Attorney and the *D. Def.* by his Attorney aforesaid Comes and defends the force and Injury whereof and the same Attorney saith that he is not impleaded by the *Plt.* of any answer for the *Def.* to the *Plt.* in the impleadment aforesaid granted and nothing further there upon saith for which the aforesaid *Plt.* remains again. & the aforesaid *Def.* there upon undefended. There fore it is Considered by the Justices here the 28th day of July anno Domini 1720. that the aforesaid *William Frisby* recover against the aforesaid *Samuel Clark* as well the sum of four hundred and Eighty four pounds of Tobacco his Damages aforesaid as also the sum of three hundred and seven

and seven pounds of Tobacco by the Court adjudged to him for his Costs and Charges by him about his Suit in this behalf laid out and Expended to be Levied of the Goods Chables Rights and Credits which were of the aforesaid *Timothy* Mulcorn at the time of his death in the hands of the aforesaid *Samuel Clark* adm. as aforesaid remaining to be administered if Sometime thereof in his hands he hath and if so much thereof in his hands he hath not then the Costs of Suit aforesaid to be Levied of the Goods and Chables of the said *Samuel Clark* and the *Def.* in mercy &c.
