 Kent County within the Jurisdiction of this Court by their Certain Bill  
 delivered here into Court brought the date whereof is the same day and year  
 a<sup>pp</sup> Bound themselves to pay to the a<sup>pp</sup> the a<sup>pp</sup> Summe of one thousand  
 and Eighty four pounds of right good Tobacco Tear from Trash and
