Ordered by the Court here that the said Edward Sumner entered into Recognizance for his appearance unto next Court to answer unto a Certain Indictment against him for feloniously Stealing a horse the Goods and Chattels of a person unknown &c. and that in the mean time he is to be of good behaviour.

Edward Sumner <sup>sd</sup> here present in Court acknowledges himself Indebted to his Lordship the <sup>sd</sup> Proprietary of this province his heirs and Successors in the Sum of twenty pounds Sterling to be Levied on his Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if he does not appear and answer the <sup>sd</sup> Indictment and Stand and abide the determination of the Court thereupon and that in the mean time he be of good behaviour wherewith he acknowledges himself to be Content.

John Wadd and James Dyal both of <sup>sd</sup> County planters here present in Court acknowledge themselves indebted to his Lordship the Lord Proprietary of this province <sup>his heirs & Successors</sup> in the Sum of ten pounds Sterling each to be levied on their Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements Conditionally that the <sup>sd</sup> Edward Sumner <sup>doe not appear answer as <sup>sd</sup> and that in the mean time he shall be of good behaviour and they acknowledge themselves to be therewith Content.</sup>

Lordship — Ordered that the <sup>sd</sup> David Ford be in the Custody of the Sher. of this County until he give Security for his appearance to next Court to answer unto a Certain Indictment against him for feloniously Stealing a Mare Colt of the Goods and Chattels of a Certain John Rogers & that in the mean time he shall be of good behaviour.
