And the a<sup>d</sup> Robert Brown in his proper person Comes & Defends the fore and Jurors when &c and appears to the a<sup>d</sup> Judgment. But the a<sup>d</sup> David Macbride Clerk of the Judgments Comes into Court and saith that he hath not sufficient Evidences to prove the premises in the a<sup>d</sup> front upon which by Consent of the Court he Enters that the a<sup>d</sup> Judgment be no further prosecuted and that all proceedings thereon cease. But that the a<sup>d</sup> Robert Brown pay the fees on the a<sup>d</sup> Judgment amounting to four hundred and fifty Eight p<sup>cs</sup> of Tobacco.
