Simon Wilmer of St. Marys County Gent here present in Court acknowledges himself indebted to his Lordship the Lord Proprietor of this province his heirs & Successors in the Sum of five pounds Sterling money to be Levied on his Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if he do not appear at the next provincial Court to be held for the province of Maryland at the City of Annapolis to give his Evidence on his Lordships behalf against the Charles Hill wherewith he acknowledges himself Content.

Mr. Gideon Pearce of St. Marys County having been sworn as high Sheriff before C<sup>o</sup> Edward Scott and Mr. Lambert Wilmer and his Sheriffs Commission being produced in Court the C<sup>o</sup> Edward Scott and Mr. Lambert Wilmer Certify that the Mr. Gideon Pearce hath taken all the Oaths according to Act of Assembly in such Case made and provided and also the oath of Sheriff & also that he hath subscribed the oath of Abjuration and Test.

The Mr. Gideon Pearce desires that James Weyat and John Rogers may be sworn as Under Sheriffs to him.

James Weyat comes into Court and takes the oath of Allegiance and Supremacy as also the oath of Abjuration and the oath of an Under Sheriff & subscribes the Test and the aforesaid Oath of Abjuration &c.

John Rogers comes into Court and takes the oath of Allegiance & Supremacy as also the oath of Abjuration and the Oath of an Under Sheriff and subscribes the Test and the aforesaid Oath of Abjuration &c.
