And the a<sup>d</sup> Def<sup>t</sup> by Thomas Bowne his Attorney Comes and defends the force and  
Fury of the a<sup>d</sup> Def<sup>t</sup> and Saving to him all and all manner of Exceptions and Advantages  
as well to the writ in the said action as also to the Deid. to the same writ pray's leave  
to make answer thereto and to answer at next Court and he hath it and the same day is given  
to also.

At which said next Court on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of August anno Dom<sup>o</sup> 1720 Came  
the a<sup>d</sup> Pl<sup>t</sup> by his a<sup>d</sup> Attorney as also the a<sup>d</sup> Def<sup>t</sup> by his said attorney. And the  
a<sup>d</sup> Def<sup>t</sup> offers himself against the said Pl<sup>t</sup> in the action a<sup>d</sup>. But the said Pl<sup>t</sup> by  
his Attorney a<sup>d</sup> Says that he will not prosecute the same action  
any further so that the said Def<sup>t</sup> remains wholly unprosecuted by the said Pl<sup>t</sup> in the  
said action. Therefore it is Considered by the Court here this 17<sup>th</sup> day of August  
1720 a<sup>d</sup>. That the said William Edwards take nothing by his writ or  
Execution a<sup>d</sup> but be in mercy for his false Claim and that the said William  
Boyers goe thereof without Day and it is also Considered that the said William  
Boyers Recover against the said William Edwards the sum of One hundred  
and thirty nine pounds of Tobacco by the Court here adjudged to him for his  
Costs and Charges by him about his Suit in this behalfe laid out and Expended  
according to the Statute &c.

DM Lordship Ordered. That the said George Macay be in the  
Custody of the Sheriff of Kent County until he give security  
for his appearance at next Court to answer unto a Certain  
Indictment against for Stealing an Hogg of the Goods and Chattels of a Certain person  
the name whereof is unknown and in the mean time to be of good behaviour  
The said Macay a<sup>d</sup> present here in Court Acknowledges himself indebted to his  
Majesty the Proprietary of this province his heires and Assignors in the sum  
of Ten pounds Sterling money to be Levied on his goods and Chattels Land and  
Tenements conditionally that if he does not appear at next Court to be held for  
County to answer the a<sup>d</sup> Indictment and stand and abide the Determination of  
the said Court there upon and in the mean time to be of good behaviour whereunto  
he acknowledges himself Content.

Robert Macay and John Clark both of Kent County present here in  
Court Acknowledge themselves indebted to his Lordship the Lord Proprietary of this province  
in the sum of five pounds Sterling money each to be Levied on their Goods  
Chattels Land and Tenements conditionally that if the a<sup>d</sup> George Macay do  
not appear and answer as a<sup>d</sup> and in the mean time be of good behaviour  
whereunto they acknowledge themselves and either of them Content.
