Ordered That Philip Holcager Enter into Recognizance for his appearance at Court as an Evidence on his Lordships behalf against the said George

Philip Holcager of Kent County Planter present here in Court who hath acknowledged to his Lordship the Lord Proprietary of this Province in the Sum of Five pounds Sterl. money to be levied on his Goods and Tenements Conditionally that if he does not appear at next Court to be held for said County as an Evidence on behalf of his said Lordship against the said George Maury wherewith he acknowledges himself Content

Ordered that William Goodson Enter into Recognizance for his appearance at next Court as an Evidence on his Lordships behalf against the same George

William Goodson of Kent County Planter present here in Court who hath acknowledged to his Lordship the Lord Proprietary of this Province in the Sum of five pounds Sterl. money to be Levied on his Goods and Tenements Conditionally That if he does not appear at next Court to be held for said County as an Evidence on behalf of his said Lordship against the said George Maury wherewith he acknowledges himself Content

Lordship The said Josiah Couch his Recognizance taken last Court in the Sum of Ten pounds Sterling money to be Levied &c. Conditionally for his Lordships Use that if he did not appear at the next Court to be held for said County to answer unto all such Objections as should be objected against him and in the mean time to be of good behaviour especially to John Beck, and now at this Court the said Josiah appearing to the said Court and no person showing Cause why the same should be discharged the Court discharges the same Recognizance

John Beck Junior and Joseph Everett at the same time entered into Recognizance for the appearance and good behaviour of the said Josiah in the Sum of five pounds Sterl. each to be Levied Conditionally for their Goods and Chables Land and Tenements and now at this Court the said Joseph having made his appearance and no Cause shown to the Court the Court discharges the same Recognizances and each of them.
