County on their oath do present that John Fanning late of Langford Bay upper hundred in said County of Down the twentieth day of Novemb. in the year of our Lord and Saviour's seven hundred & nine at Pauls parish in the County of Down within the jurisdiction of this Court being by virtue of a certain indenture then in force possessed of a certain orphan boy named Edward Canel to keep & maintain the said orphan boy after the manner of an apprentice from the date of the said indenture specified & abovesentioned for and until the said orphan boy should arrive to the age of one & twenty years in which said indenture it was expressed that the said John Fanning the said orphan boy should teach & instruct or procure to be taught & instructed in the art or mystery of a house Carpenter or any other trade he could do & should keep the said orphan boy to the trade of for and during the ~~time~~ time in the said indenture mentioned for the term of six years to not to turn or oblige the said orphan boy to work or labour at any other employment than in the said indenture mentioned but the said John the said orphan boy hath not taught or procured to be taught his trade but at Pauls parish in the County of Down within the jurisdiction of this Court hath kept the said orphan boy to other work & labour than mentioned in the said indenture to the great damage of the said Board against the peace of our said Lord Prop. his rule & dignity & against the form of an Act of Assembly of this province now in force in such cases made & provided by Johnson & Co. 1714.
