free born; I do therefore grant his said applications and hereby Certify that  
from his own account he is about thirty four years of age, five feet eight inches <sup>high</sup>  
or thereabouts, of a black Complexion, was born in Queen Anne County and raised  
in Caroline County and has a scar of a cut over his right eye, and has a small  
scar on his right thumb joint, and has a large scar on his right leg occasioned  
by the bite of a dog. And has no other notable marks or scars that I have
