to wit: On the second day of June in the year of Our Lord One thou-
sand eight hundred and two, a certain Charles Plair of Caroline
county aforesaid by deed of Manumission duly executed & recorded
did manumit & set free a certain negro woman called Henry to
be free and at liberty from and after the first day of January
eighteen hundred and eighteen: and whereas the same negro
woman named Henry has made application to me for a
certificate of her freedom agreeably to the Act of Assem-
bly in such case made and provided, and I being satisfied by the
Oath of William Willow that the said negro woman named
Henry, for whom this certificate is made, is the indentured negro
woman mentioned in the said Manumission I do therefore
grant her said application, and hereby certify that the said
negro woman Henry is five feet two and ^{three} quarters
inches high or thereabouts about nineteen years of age, of
a dark brown complexion her hair woolly has two small
scars on the upper part of the right arm above the elbow
joint, and has no other notable mark that I have seen
