 said manumission, I do therefore grant her said application, and hereby Certi-
 fy that from the age expressed in the said manumission the said Maria
 was twenty two years of age or there abouts on the eighth day of February
 last past, she is about five feet two inches high, of a dark brown complexion
 was born and raised in Caroline County has a small scar on the upper
 part of her left arm above the elbow joint caused by a burn and a small
 scar on her right hand near the joint of her fore finger and no other par-
 ticular mark or scar that I have discovered.
