FURTHER AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

By Mr. Williams, of Harford:

Amend section 4 of the Census Bill by striking out all after the words "be it enacted," and insert in its place the following: "That on or before the 20th day of April, in the year 1901, the several Boards of Supervisors of Elections of the city of Baltimore and the respective counties of this State, shall appoint in the manner in which the clerks of election for each election precinct are required to be appointed, two persons for each enumeration district for which an enumerator was appointed for the taking of the Federal Census in the year 1900. The said persons so appointed shall be of good character, and of approved intelligence and clerical capacity, competent in every way to perform the duties imposed upon them by this Act. And they shall be residents of the enumeration district for which they shall be appointed.
