Sidney Jump, Sergeant-at-Arms and Samuel J. Bell, Chief Engrossing Clerk, together with the Rules then adopted, are hereby declared to be the Officers and Rules governing the Senate of Maryland during its present session.

Mr. Putzel called for the division of the question upon the adoption of said substitute as comprehending propositions distinct in substance.

The Chair ruled that said substitute did not comprehend such distinct propositions.

Mr. Putzel appealed from the ruling of the Chair.
