FURTHER AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

By Mr. Bryan:

Strike out all amendments adopted and all after the words "A Bill," and substitute in lieu thereof the following:

Entitled "An Act creating a sewerage system for Baltimore city and authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to issue the stock of said corporation to an amount not exceeding twelve million (\$12,000,000), dollars for the purpose of providing, constructing and maintaining a public sewerage system, to provide for the collection and disposal of the sewage of said city, and the inhabitants thoereof, and to authorize the submission of an ordinance for that purpose to the legal voters of said city.

"Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Thomas G. Hayes, Wallace Stebbins, Benjamin T. Fendall, Alfred M Quick, Charles E. Phelps. Jr., and two members to be appointed by the Mayor of Baltimore, subject to the confirmation of a majority of all the members elected to the Second Branch of the City Council of Baltimore, be and are hereby constituted a commission to be known as the "Sewerage Commission for Baltimore City." Said commission to serve without pay, unless otherwise determined by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore. That the Mayor shall be ex-officioa member and the president of the said commission, and the said commission shall elect one of its number secretary of said commission. The said commission shall forthwith adopt and construct such a sewerage system for Baltimore city, and the inhabitants thereof, as said commission may deem best adapted and suited for said sewerage service. The said commission shall
