Thereupon the said James Carrimore humbly prays the Court that the said John Gurley may be adjudged to serve him according to Law for the Runaway time and Charge &c &c.

Whereupon the Court having naturally considered the same do adjudge that the said Gurley serve his said Master seven days for every day that he was absent which amounts to seven and seven days &c Likewise the said John Gurley is further adjudged to serve his said Master Eight months in full for the said Eight hundred pounds of tobacco paid as aforesaid — all which Service to commence at the Expiration of the said John Gurley's Privilege &c —

Upon the petition of Roger Phillips and William Mose against Jacob Crouch it is Ordered that Summons Issue against the said Jacob Crouch returnable to Next Court &c —

Ordered by the Court that the Sherif. of Somerset County pay unto Andrew Lawley the Sum of five pounds Nineteen Shillings and five pence, for Carrying on the Road, the aforesaid Sum of five pounds Nineteen Shillings and five pence to be paid out of the fines &c —

Ordered by the Court that the Sherif. of Somerset County pay unto George Greer the Sum of Eight pounds ten Shillings and two pence, for Carrying on the Road, the said Eight pounds ten Shillings & two pence to be paid out of the fines &c —
