Foster Gentleman being called to make return of the pannel of the grand Jurors, return the same which Jurors are as followeth vizt. - Adam Heatch, William Richardson, Margis Dickson, Robert Hodge, John Ealy, George Jarman, Thomas Coguter, Samuel Derigson, Solomon Claiborne, William Adams, John Stephens, Jeffery Long, John Cressman, Crispin Crue Richard Nicholson Jun^r, John Jarman, John Horton, John Bratton, Thomas Dickson Manly, William Eger, Lewis Disharoon & Robert Hall who being severally called appeared, and were sworn and charged and sent out to consider & who soon after appeared and present to the Court the following bills of Indictment, being content that the Court should amend form altering no manner of substance in them vizt. Indictment against Joan Slack, John Newbold Benjⁿ True Rebecca Fickett, William White John E. Come John Sayler, Mary Jones, Michael Dashed Jane Duckett, Isabella Husk James Driskill, Edward Canock Thomas Benston William Robinson, William Miles, Thomas Brown & Mary Botilla, thereupon the grand Jurors are accordingly discharged & ordered that they be allowed the sum of five hundred pounds of tobacco to be paid next Levy Court and against the several persons of Indicted it is ordered that Cap^t. John Jones be returnable to next Court &

John Jones and William Sloughston Esq^r agree with some person to take care of the said Crisilla Servis and to allow her a sufficiency, and they shall be allowed for the same at the saying of the County Levy next, & they the said John Jones & William Sloughston to make their report to next Court &c.

Letter from Daniel Dulany Esq^r Prosecutor General of his Lordships Pleas in the province of Maryland, to this County Court of Somerset for to appoint a fit person to act as Prosecutor of this Lordships Pleas in the said County, for as much as William Tazewell the former prosecutor in the County of Prince Georges, and before to reside in this Province and declines the same &c. thereupon the Court are all of opinion that Levi Gale of Somerset County Gentl^l is a fit person, and that he act as prosecutor in the County of Somerset, and prosecute his Lordships Pleas unless such time as a commission be produced from the said Dulany for the Prosecutor, place of &c. thereupon the said Levi Gale present here in Court made oath that he would act as Prosecutor in the County of Somerset to the Best of his Skill & Knowledge &c.
