Road which is very Mirey lies now, am not willing to stop it till I had acquainted your worshipps  
of the same hoping your worshipps will be pleased to grant and your worshipps Petitioner shall as  
in duty bound Ever pray ----- William Alexander

The petition aforesaid being read & heard and Maturely Considered. It's ordered by the  
Justices that the said William Alexander turn the Road according to the direction of Capt. John Jones  
and William Sloughton Esq<sup>r</sup>; and that they direct the turning of the same &c -

To the worshipful his Lordship's Justices of Somerset County Now Sitting the humble petition of John  
Turpin Sheweth that your petitioner hath a tract of Land Lying on Bank Creek at  
Manor and the Bounds are uncertain and your petitioner prays that your worshipps  
will appoint some proper persons to Enquire into the truth of the bounds of the said Land called  
Davis's Choice according to the form of an Act of assembly of this province in that Case made & provided  
and as in duty bound shall pray ----- John Turpin

The petition aforesaid being read & heard and fully considered it's ordered  
by the Court that a Commission Issue to Capt. John Jones, Capt. William Clauser Robert King and  
Upsher King of Somerset County Gentlemen, and that they or any three or two of them meet on the  
aforesaid Land, and take the depositions of the Several Evidences that shall be to them produced &c -  
& the same reduce into writing &c -

be granted the said George Full giving Security according to Law &c -

unto his Lordship his heirs and Successors in the sum of twenty pounds Sterd Joyfully & Severally to be  
Levied on their Body, Goods or Chattels Lands or tenements for the use of his said Lordship the Lord-  
proprietary In Case the said George Full Entertain any freeman, or Sock person in <sup>his</sup> ~~their~~ house or  
above twenty four hours (Count times & equalled) unless such person be capable to give his vote for  
(ad legem)
