Ordered by the Court that William White pay unto Thomas Dashiell the Sum of Ninety pounds of Tobacco being due unto him for his attendance three days as Evidence on behalf of his Lordship the Lord Proprietary against the said William White, him the having made Oath to the same & —

Ordered by the Court that Benjamin Nesom pay unto Thomas Dashiell the Sum of Ninety pounds of Tobacco being due unto him for his attendance three days as Evidence on Behalf of his Lordship the Lord Proprietary against him the said Benjamin Eason, he having made Oath to the same & —

Ordered by the Court that Edward Chapman pay unto Abigail Wright the Sum of One hundred and fifty pounds of Tobacco being due unto her for her attendance five days as an Evidence on Behalf of the said Edward Chapman at Suite of his Lordship the Lord Proprietary she having made Oath to the same & —

Upon the Petition of Deceased of the Inhabitants of the Sea side in Somerset County to have a ferry erected over the Indian River at the Plantation of a certain Benjamin Aydelett & —

Whereupon it is agreed upon by the Court that if a certain William Groves will keep a publick ferry over the said Indian River, at the Plantation of the said Benj. Aydelett & find & provide a sufficient Boat fitting to carry horse & Man over the said River & that he shall be allowed for the same after the rate of fifteen hundred pounds of Tobacco of the Year - And that Samuel Dorickson (Barred from St. Martins Chapple to the said Ferry & —

Samuel Long & William Long's Recognizance } Whereas Samuel Long and William being Bound by Recognizance by Capt. William Robinson, Nowhere at this day to wit the twentieth

Day of March and down One thousand Seven hundred & twenty three the said Sam. Long & William Long made their appearance & were accordingly discharged & from their Recognizance & Whereupon It is ordered by the Court that the said Sam. Long and William Long give New Recognizance in fifty pounds for their appearance at dividing Creek, the first Tuesday of April next before the Justices of the Peace Nisi prius, and Justices of Oyer & Terminer and Goal delivery to give Evidence on Behalf of the said Lord Proprietary against the said William Robinson & not to depart the same Court without Licence thereof & —

Whereupon a certain Jeffery Long of Somerset County Gent. present here in Court undertakes for the said Samuel, and William Long, and acknowledged himself to owe & stand Justly Indebted in his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary his heirs & Successors in the Sum of fifty pounds Court money to be levied on his body Goods or Chattels Lands or Tenements for the use of his said Lordship In Case the said Sam. and William Long do not make their personal appearance at dividing Creek in Somerset County of the third first Tuesday of April next before the Justices of the Peace Nisi prius, and Justices of Oyer & Terminer and Goal delivery and give Evidence on behalf (of)
