Whereupon came into Court a certain Alexander Hall of the County of Somerset Gent. and prays that a certain Capell King of the same County

may give security for his good behaviour towards him, and makes oath that he doth not fear the Surety against him out of hatred or Malice which he bears him, but for safety of his person from harm and to preserve his life. Thereupon it is ordered by the Court that the said Capell King give recognizance in ten pounds Sterling with two Security in five pounds Sterling each for his good behaviour and appearance at next Court.

Thereupon the said Capell King acknowledged himself to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary his heirs and Successors in the Sum of ten pounds Sterling to be levied on his Body goods or Chattels Lands or tenements for the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors. In Case he does not make his personal appearance before the Justices of Our County Court to be held at Dividing Creek in Somerset County the third Tuesday of August next and answer unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary concerning all such matters and things as shall be then and there objected against him on his Lordship's behalf and to stand & abide the Judgment of the Court thereupon and not to depart the same Court without Licence thereof and in the mean time to be of good Behaviour to all his Lordship's Loyal People and more especially to the said Alexander Hall.

Likewise the said Ephraim Wilson and Francis Allen both of Somerset County Gent. present here in Court undertake for the said Capell King & he acknowledged themselves to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary his heirs and Successors in the Sum of five pounds Sterling each to be levied on their Body's goods or Chattels Lands or tenements jointly and severally for the use of his said Lordship. In Case the said Capell King does not make his personal appearance before the Justices of Our County Court to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August next and answer unto his Lordship concerning all such matters and things as shall be then and there objected against him on his Lordship's behalf and to stand & abide the Judgment of the Court thereupon and not to depart the same Court without Licence thereof and in the mean time to be of the good Behaviour to all his Lordship's Loyal people and more especially to Alexander Hall.
