Thereupon it is ordered by the Court that the said William Miles give recognizance for his good behavior and appearance at Next Court to shew upon the said William Miles present here in Court acknowledged himself to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto the right honorable the Lord proprietary his heirs and Successors in the Sum of ten pounds, Sterl. to be levied on his body goods or Chattels, Land, or tenements for the use of his said Lordship. In case the said William Miles do not make his personal appearance before the Justices of our County Court to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August Next to answer unto his Lordship concerning all such matters and things as shall be then & there objected against him on his Lordship's behalf and to stand & abide the Judgment of the Court thereupon and not to depart the same Court without License thereof and in the mean time to be of the good behavior to all his Lordship's large people &c. Likewise a certain William Copper and Samuel Riggini of Somerset County Gentlemen present here in Court undertakes for the said William Miles and acknowledged themselves to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto the right honorable the Lord proprietary in the Sum of five pounds Sterling each to be levied on their body goods and Chattels, Land, or tenements for the use of his said Lordship jointly and severally. In case the said William Miles do not make his personal appearance before the Justices of our County Court to be held at Dividing Creek in Somerset County the third Tuesday of August next to answer unto his Lordship concerning all such matters and things as shall be then and there objected against him on his Lordship's behalf and to stand & abide the Judgment of the Court thereupon and not to depart the same Court without License thereof and in the mean time to be of good Behavior to all his Lordship's large people &c.

Whereas a certain Absolom Ford came into Court and swore that he never did say to Stephen Fournier, as William Miles when he was working hogs, see shall have fresh Cork by and by and that he never heard any blows Struck upon any hogs by William Miles when he was in presence with Stephen Fournier.
