Whereupon Command is given to the Sherif. of Somerset County that immediately he Cause to come here to be examined by whom & who neither be to be inquired because as well by of which said precept the said Sherif. to wit Joseph M^r Esterlynt makes return that he hath been ready twelve & as by his Enceipth was commanded and the Jurors of that Jury therein Impanelled being called in to wit William Hardy, Joseph Howson, Daniel Eder, Giddion Filman, Richard Phillips, Charles Townsend, John Starbrough, John Gillett, George ~~Wentworth~~ Alex^r Maddux Thomas Baker Mary Fountain who being duly elected tryed & sworn to say the truth in the premises upon their Oath do say that the said James Dursk is not guilty of the premises. Wherefore it is considered by the Justices that his Lordship the Lord proprietary take Nothing by the Indictment. aft and that the said James Dursk be there acquitted & thereupon its Ordered by the Court that the said James Dursk give security for payment of the Severall Officers their fees due by reason of the premises aft. Whereupon a certain Mores Dursk present here in Court acknowledged himself to owe & stand Justly Indebted unto his said Lordship the Lord proprietary in the sum of ten pounds Sterl. to be Levied & In Case he doth not pay his Severall Officers their fees due by reason of the premises aft & —

Richard Tyler } Whereas a certain Richard Tyler said, that James Darlitt one of the Justices of
Recognizance } Somerset County had given a false Judgment. which words was proved in open Court
the said Richard Tyler present & Thereupon its Ordered by the Court that the said Rich-
Tyler give good security for his good Behaviour and appearance at next Court, but for want -
thereof the said Richard Tyler is committed into the Custody of the Sherif. of Somerset County -
thence to Lonsan, the said Sherif. present here in Court took charge of him accordingly & —
Afterwards in the same Court the said Richard Tyler together with Adam Smith his security
acknowledged themselves to owe & stand Justly Indebted unto his Lordship the light house-
: be the Lord proprietary his heirs and Successors in the sum of ten pounds Sterl. to be
Levied on their Lands and tenements goods or Chattels, legally & lawfully for the use of
his said Lordship In Case the said Richard Tyler do not make his personal appearance
before the Justices of our County Court to be hold at Durdungh Creek the third Tuesday of August
Next to answer unto his said Lordship concerning all such Matters and things as shall be then
there objected against him on his Lordship's behalf & to stand & abide Judgment of the Court there-
: upon and not to depart the same Court without Licence thereof and in the Mean time to be of the
good behaviour to all his Lordship's large people & —
