 Mr. Williams lately in Our County Court of Somerset (to wit) on the twentieth day of June in the
 third year of Our Dominion &c. And David One thousand Seven hundred & Seven ten by & the
 the worshipful Charles Ballard and his associates Justices of Our said Court at Dividing Creek and
 by Consideration of Our said Court Recovered against a certain Francis Hambling of all hollows
 Parish in the County of Lancaster as well the sum of Seven hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco
 Debt as also the sum of two hundred and fifty six pounds of tobacco Costs of this said out of &c.
 : Dec whereof he is bound as by the record &c. thereof in Our said Court Remaining manifestly
 appears and afterwards (that is to say) the said John Mr. Williams at Somerset County made his last
 will and Testament in writing, and by the same constituted and ordained Rose his wife Executrix
 of his testament &c. and hereyeto, afterwards the said Rose &c. as aforesaid Intermarried with a certain
 Joseph Shipping as by the Intimation of the said Joseph was have &c. and altho' Judgt. be
 thereupon rendered Nevertheless Execution for the Debt and Costs aforesaid as yett remains to be done
 Whereupon the said Joseph Shipping and Rose his wife &c. of the said John Mr. Williams both
 Supplicated to us to provide them a full remedy in this behalf and we being willing that those
 things which in Our said Court are Rightly done should be brought to due Execution Command
 you that by good and Lawfull men of your Bailly which you make known unto the said Francis
 Hambling that he be and appear before the Justices of Our County Court to be hold at Dividing Creek
 in Somerset County on the third Tuesday of June next to show Cause if any thing for himself he
 hath or knoweth to say why the said Joseph Shipping and Rose his wife &c. as aforesaid ought
 not to have their &c. of the Debt and Costs aforesaid against the said Francis Hambling according to the form
 force and Effect of the Recovery aforesaid if to him it shall seem meet and further to do and leave that
 which Our said Court shall consider of and have you shew the Names of those by whom you
 make &c. known and this with a Witness Joseph Gray Secd: Chief Justice of Our said Court
 22th day of May in the 3th year of Our Dominion &c. And Done: 1724. -

At which said third Tuesday of June to wit the Sixteenth day of the same Month and Year One thousand Seven hundred & twenty four Being the day of the return of the said writ Cometh the said Joseph Shipping and Rose his wife &c as aforesaid by their attorney aforesaid and the Sheriff of Somerset County to whom the foregoing writ was directed Likewise Cometh & maketh return thereof to the Court here Endorsed in these words following viz. To the Worshipful Justices of Somerset County I humbly Certifie that I have made known unto the within Named Francis Hambling that he be and appear before the Justices within Mentioned at the time & place within Contained to shew Cause why the within Named Joseph Shipping should not have his Execution against him for Debt and Costs within Contained before Matthew Hopkin & John Doregood and
