Wherefore it is considered by the Justice here that the said Ann Woods be fined to the Lord proprietary for the fact afo the sum of six hundred pounds of tobacco. Whereupon its Ordered by the Court that the said Ann Woods give security for the payment of the fine afo and the severall Officers their fees due by reason of the premises

Thereupon a certain Lazarus Widdup of Somerset parish present in Court undertakes for the said Ann Woods to pay the fine afo and the severall Officers their fees due by reason of the premises afo &c

Ordered that James Bowcher be Overseer of the road from Broad Creek bridge half way to the Cow bridge - it being the half of Wm. Burtens Limitts from the Cow bridge &c -

Whereas a certain John Sorkney petitioned this Court to be tax free for the premises considered, Its therefore Ordered by the Court that the said John Sorkney be tax free for the future &c

Whereas a certain John Davis petitioned this Court to be tax free for the premises considered Its therefore Ordered by the Court that the said John Davis be tax free for the future &c

Whereas a certain Matthew Dorman, and Abraham Heath having Repaired the bridge over Manoran River at the head thereof, at agreement. - the said Matthew Dorman and Abraham Heath present here in Court, is Ordered by the Justice to give recognizance in thirty pounds Sterl. each for the keeping the said Bridge in good repair at their own proper costs and charge ten years &c - Thereupon the said Matthew Dorman & Abraham Heath acknowledged themselves to owe and stand Justly Indebted ^{to his Lordship} the right honorable the Lord proprietary his heirs and Successors in the sum of thirty pounds Sterl each to be levied on their body goods and Chattels Lands or tenements In case they do not keep the said Bridge in good Repair at their own proper costs and charge ten full years - In consideration thereof they the said Matthew Dorman & Abraham Heath are to be allowed each of them the sum of two hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco &c
