Colbeck more to the foresaid fallen white Oak marked as aforesaid with a Mulberry Bost
Setting at the root of the same as aforesaid and being on the Southwest side of a fresh
water run as aforesaid about fifteen paces from the Main road and on the Northwest side
of the same as aforesaid and the said Jeremiah Townsend aged Sixty One years or there
about on his Corporall Oath administered ^{to him} as aforesaid Sayeth that Mr James Rouns Senior
a little before he went to England which he thinks was Six or Seven and Twenty years —
ago, Brought him the ^{said} Townsend to the fore mentioned ^{place} white Oak and said to him the
said Townsend this is my Border and further Sayeth Not ———

The same Second day of November Instant in presence of the said Complainant (no Defendant
= appearing) came Capt William Fayett aged Sixty two years or thereabouts before in the
said William Selby, William Richardson, and Robert Martin on the aforesaid Tract
of Land called Bleaching hirst to a stump of a white Oak and a Mulberry Bost
Setting by it on the Brink of a steep bank on the Southwest side of a fresh water run
By the side of a Bath which was formerly a County road the said Stump and Bost being a
Bout Twenty eight paces Southwest from the said run at which Place as here described
the said William Fayett aged as aforesaid being by no Examined on his Corporall Oath as aforesaid Sayeth
that forty two years ago or thereabouts he very well remembers he saw that a white Oak
marked or Notched on four sides where the aforesaid Stump now is and that he always ^{understands} that the
said marked white Oak was James Rouns border and that he really thinks that the
Stump last mentioned is the Stump of that Tree he saw marked as aforesaid at the time aforesaid
and Several times since and further Sayeth Not ———

At the same time and Place the above mentioned the Complainant Alledged that he had a
Notther Evidence to produce concerning the last mentioned Border named Ephraim Heattier
who was the Next of the County as he Supposed and at the said Complainants request was
Publicly in presence of all persons assembled and appointed Colbeck Meeting
