And whereupon the said Mary by Francis Allen her attorney complains that whereas the said Andrew the twenty fifth day of March One thousand Seven hundred and twenty One at Somerset County afo<sup>r</sup> within the Jurisdiction of this Court was Indebted unto the said William in his Lifetime in thirteen pound Eight Shillings and five Pence Lawfull money of America as by an and hereunto annexed may in Court appear and being so thereof Indebted the said Andrew in Consideration thereof afterwards to with the afo<sup>r</sup> twenty fifth day of March in the Year afo<sup>r</sup> at the place afo<sup>r</sup> upon himself did assume and to the said William in his Lifetime then and there did faithfully promise that he the said Andrew the said thirteen pound Eight Shillings and five pence to the said William What he should be afterwards thereunto requested he would well and faithfully pay and Content Nevertheless the said Andrew his promise and assumption afo<sup>r</sup> said in form afo<sup>r</sup> made little regarding but plotting and fraudulently Intending the said William in his Lifetime, and the said Mary after the death of the said William in that part Craftily and Subtly to devise and defraud the said thirteen pound Eight Shillings and five pence or any part thereof unto the said William in his Lifetime or to the afo<sup>r</sup> Mary after the death of the said William or to either of them both not paid or Contented altho the same to do y<sup>e</sup> D<sup>r</sup> Andrew by the said William in his Lifetime afterwards to with on the afo<sup>r</sup> Twenty fifth day of March in the year afo<sup>r</sup> and by the said Mary on the first Day of May One thousand Seven hundred and Twenty Two and often afterwards at Somerset County afo<sup>r</sup> within the afo<sup>r</sup> for he never requested thereunto but the same to the said William in his Lifetime or to the afo<sup>r</sup> Mary after the Death of the said William to pay hath hitherto refused and the same to the said Mary to pay still doth refuse and Delay. Whereupon she saith she is worse and hath Damage to the value of Twenty five pounds money afo<sup>r</sup>. And whereupon she brings Suit &c. And brings into Court here the Letters of Adm<sup>r</sup> by w<sup>ch</sup> &c.
