that he should take the aforesaid Mary Ash of Stogney Parish if she should be found in his Bailiwick, and her should safe
keep so that he might have her Body before his Lordship Justice of Somersett County Court the third Tuesday of
March next at Dividing Creek to answer unto his Lordship concerning a certain Breach aforesaid against the same her
son and that thereof he should not fail &c.

At which said third Tuesday of March to wit the
Nineteenth day of the said month Ann^d One Thousand Seven hundred and twenty two, being the day of
return of the said Writ, Comme & Show of Somersett County and makes return hereof Edward Bigg^t Optic for M^r Estur^t

Whereupon the said Mary Ash appears and coming into the Bar is thereupon lawfully demand-
ed how she would acquit herself of the Breach aforesaid She sayeth that of the Breach aforesaid above Imposed of on her
she is guilty thereof and submits to the mercy of the Court and forasmuch as the said Mary Ash hath not
wherewithall to pay her fine for the fact aforesaid.

Therefore it is considered by the Justices here that the said Mary
Ash be led to the whipping Post and there be whipt on the bare back with fifteen lashes well laid on while the blood
appear - and thereupon as to Corporate punishment aforesaid command is given to the Sheriff of Somersett County that he
do him of immediate Execution according to Judgment aforesaid by whiping the said Mary Ash at the publick
whipping Post with fifteen lashes on the bare back well laid on while the blood appear - Afterward, in the
same Court the Sheriff returns that he has done the Execution of Judgment as to the Corporate Punishment aforesaid he was
commanded - Whereas Thomas Holbrook Surveyor under Acknowledged himself to be and stand
Infully Indebted unto his Lordship his Lordships and Successors in the sum off five pounds Current money to be recovered on his
goods and chattels - In case the said do not deliver the said Mary Ash up to the County Court or the Sheriff of said
County at the Execution of his sentence to be paid him County al fees that accrued by action of the Commissioners
aforesaid - The said Mary Ash to serve the said Thomas Holbrook Nine months &c - Whereupon
she is discharged &c.
