Memorandum that this day came before the Subscriber Ann Whely of Rowley Parish with her Surety Francis Anderson ~~and~~ who did acknowledge himself to be indebted unto his Lordship the Proprietor of this Province to be levied upon his goods and Chattels Lands and tenements for the Use of his Lordship and his Successors &c. This Cognizance is such that if the above Ann Whely do appear at our County Court to be held at Dwidney Creek by his Lordship's Justice the 18th day of Instant being the third Tuesday of and doth answer unto what shall be objected against her for Breach ~~of~~ and bringing a Bastard Child in or about the month of April last in the County and Parish aforesaid and doth stand by all and abide Judgment then this Cognizance to be void of void Effort otherwise to stand in full force and virtue in Law &c.

Now here at this day to witt the 21st Eighteen the day of June A. M. D. One thousand and Seven hundred and twenty three came in Court the said Ann Whely in her proper Person and prayd that her appearance may be entered to save her selfe and Surety from a certain Cognizance of Bail Entered into as above said

Whereupon the said Ann Whely's appearance is accordingly Entered and to save her selfe and Surety as aforesaid is Crad - Whereupon it is Ordered by the Court that the said Ann Whely give New Cognizance in the Sum of ten pounds Curr. money with her Surety in the Sum of five pounds Curr. money for the said Ann Whely's appearance at the County Court to be held at Dwidney Creek in Sommersett County the third Tuesday of June November next, But for want thereof the said Ann Whely is Committed into the Custody of ~~the~~ Joseph Maudslowe High Sheriff of the County aforesaid. Whereupon the said Joseph Maudslowe Esq. our Court here in Court took Charge of the said Ann Whely accordingly. And afterwards in the same Court came the said Ann Whely with Daniel Cawdery of Sommersett County Esquire her Surety, and the said Ann Whely acknowledged herself to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto his Lordship the Proprietor in the Sum of ten pounds Curr. money to be levied on her Body goods and Chattels Lands and tenements, for the Use of his said Lordship the Lord Proprietory - In Case the said Ann Whely do not make her personal appearance before the Justice of our County Court to be held at Dwidney Creek the third Tuesday of November next, to answer unto his Lordship's Concerning all such matters and things as shall be then and there Objected against her on his Lordship's behalf and not to depart the same Court without License and to stand and abide Judgment of the Court thereon then the above Cognizance to be void otherwise to have &c.

Like wise the said Daniel Cawdery Esquire came in Court as aforesaid acknowledged himself to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto his said Lordship the Lord Proprietory in the Sum of five pounds Curr. money to be levied on his Body goods and Chattels Lands and tenements for the Use of his said Lordship the Lord Proprietory. In Case the said Ann Whely do not make her personal appearance before the Justice of our County Court to be held at Dwidney Creek in Sommersett County aforesaid the third Tuesday of November next to answer unto his Lordship's Concerning all such matters and things as shall be then and there Objected against her on his Lordship's behalf and to stand & abide Judgment of the Court thereon and not to depart the same Court without License thereof &c.
