Commanded was given to the Pow^t. of Somersett that he should take Thomas Laws, George
Bozman and Thomas Dashille of many, John Jones, William Stoughton and Cap^t Wm. Saffor
King late of Somersett Parish Church Bury man of the Said Parish and William Saffor
and Underwood Rousher late of the Said Parish Church Wardens thereof if they should be found in his
Babewick and them should safe keep so that he might have them bodies before the Justices of his Lordship County
Court of Somersett to be held at Bridgwater Creek the third Tuesday of June next to answer unto Thomas Cary
of a plea of trespass upon the case &c. and that none of them should not fail &c.
And the said Thomas Cary by Lewis Gale his attorney proceeded against the said Thomas Laws, George Bozman
and Thomas Dashille of many, John Jones, Wm. Stoughton Cap^t Wm. Saffor and Underwood Rousher in
the Pleas as follows viz

Somersett County sc^t. Thomas Laws, George Bozman son, Thomas Dashille
of many, John Jones, William Stoughton and Cap^t King late of Somersett Parish Church Bury man of
the Said Parish and William Saffor and Underwood Rousher late of the Said Parish Church Wardens
thereof were attested to answer unto Thomas Cary of a plea of trespass upon the case &c.

And whereupon the said Thomas Cary by Lewis Gale his attorney complained that whereas the said Bury and
Church Wardens 113 thirtieth day of April ~~Answered~~ Questioned Seven hundred and twenty three in their
affairies were at Somersett Parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid within the aforesaid Jurisdiction Indebted unto the aforesaid
Thomas four thousand five hundred pounds of tobacco for the late sum, levied by the Bury man and Church Wardens
of the Said Parish of the Said Cary, for the use of the Said Cary applied towards defraying of Parish Charge and so
thereof being Indebted the said Thomas Laws, George Bozman son, Thomas Dashille, John Jones, Wm. Stoughton
Cap^t King William Saffor and Underwood Rousher 113 day and year aforesaid at the Pleas aforesaid within the aforesaid Jurisdiction
in Consideration whereof upon their oaths affirmed and to the said Cary then and there faithfully promised that they
sum offour thousand five hundred pounds of tobacco when afterwards the said Cary should of the Bury and Church
Wardens of the parish aforesaid request it, by him to the said Cary it should be paid and accounted November 113 B.P. 1728 aforesaid
Thomas Laws, George Bozman son, Thomas Dashille, John Jones, William Stoughton Cap^t King Wm. Saffor and
Underwood Rousher Bury man and Church Wardens as aforesaid promise and affump^t aforesaid in form aforesaid
little regarding Butt Clotting and fraudulently Intending the aforesaid Thomas Cary in that intent to defraud and deceive
the aforesaid sum of four thousand five hundred pounds of tobacco or any part thereof to the aforesaid Thomas (altho' the aforesaid
Thomas Laws, George Bozman son, Thomas Dashille, John Jones, William Stoughton Cap^t King Wm. Saffor
and Underwood Rousher was thence required afterwards to the fifteenth day of May One thousand Seven hundred
and twenty three at Somersett Parish aforesaid within the aforesaid Jurisdiction but not paid or in any wise accounted but they
and every of them the same wills to pay or in any wise content have altogether refused and shall do the same whereby
the said Thomas says he is the worse and hath damage to the value of Nine thousand pounds of tobacco and more
of the which this Justice & I Gale Ques. C. Edges C. J. Doe & Rich. Rose
