Memo<sup>r</sup>andum: The C<sup>ts</sup> by Francis Allen his attorney sued out his Lordships writ of Habeas  
- <sup>facias</sup> against the Deft the tenore of which Writ follows in these words viz -  
Maryland s<sup>ts</sup> Charles absolute Lord and Proprietarie of the Colonies of Maryland and Avalon  
his wife & - Lord Baron of Baltimore & s<sup>ts</sup> the Sher<sup>iff</sup> of Somerset County greeting Whereas at County Court  
held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of November 1721 in cause <sup>then</sup> ~~heard~~ <sup>between</sup> ~~the~~ depending Between Nathaniel  
Horsey C<sup>ts</sup> and John Gumbly and Sarah his wife & s<sup>ts</sup> Defts the said C<sup>ts</sup> returned Judgment against the said Defts  
as well for the Sum of Eleven pounds fourteen Shillings Six pence half Penny a certain debt due and borrowed

the said former Judgment aft<sup>r</sup> for the debt and Cook aft<sup>r</sup> according to the form of the Writory aft<sup>r</sup> is against them the said  
John Gumbly and Sarah his wife Ought not to have if to them it shall seem meet and how you shall Execute this  
Writ that you make known unto the Justices of Our said Court at the day and place aft<sup>r</sup> and have you there this writ  
Charles Ballard your Chief Judge of Our said Court this twelfth day of March and in the seventh Year of Our said
