Therefore it is Considered by the Justices here the Eighteenth day of June And doth One thousand Seven hundred and twenty three that the said sum of twelve Shillings and six pence so as aforesaid attached in the hands of the said Jonathan Dickenson as of the rights and Credits of the said William Gilchrist towards Satisfying unto the said John Scarborough as well the sum of three pound Curr. money and four hundred pounds of tobacco as also the Costs accruing upon the Writ of attachment: &c and that the said John Scarborough have his Execution thereof against the said Jonathan Dickenson according to act of assembly &c

Therefore it is Considered by the Justices here the same day and year last mentioned that the said sum of Nine Shillings and two pence part of the sum so attached and Confesed be Confesed in the hands of the said Charles Ramsey as of the rights and Credits of the said William Gilchrist towards Satisfying unto the said John Scarborough as well the sum of three pound Curr. money and four hundred pounds of tobacco as also the Costs accruing upon the aforesaid Writ of attachment: and that the said John Scarborough have his Execution thereof against the said Charles Ramsey according to act of assembly &c

Memorandum The Letters by George Dashiell the attorney sued out his Lordships Writ of Summons against the Defts the tenor of which Writ follows in these Words viz

Somerset County ss: Charles absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Colonies of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c To the Sheriff of Somerset County greeting Where as a certain John Watts of Somerset County longer lately in the County Court of Somerset to wit the twenty first day of November One thousand Seven hundred and Eighteen before the Worshipful Charles Ballard Justice and his associates then Justices of our said County and by consideration of the same Court (at dividing Creek) recovered against a certain Thomas Goddard of Stagnay Parish in Somerset County Taylor as well the sum of fifteen thousand pounds of tobacco a certain debt as also the sum of three hundred and fifty One pounds of tobacco for said Out and Expended whereof he is Committed as of the record and process thereof in our said Court remaining before the Justices thereof manifestly appear and for as much as Execution remaineth thereupon as yett to be done and because we will that those things which in our said Court are rightly done and acknowledged should be brought to due Execution and the said John Watts being since dead, who died Intestate as is said after whose death administration of all and singular the goods Chattels rights and Credits of the said John Watts dec'd to and his wife was Legally committed and whereas the said Ann after the administration aforesaid to her committed is since Intermarried to a certain Thomas Collier of the County aforesaid as by Submition We have recd; and for as much as the debt and Costs aforesaid remaineth unpaid and unsatisfied We therefore Command you that by good and Lawfull men of your Bailiwick you make known unto the said Thomas Goddard if he shall be found in your Bailiwick that he be and appear before the Justices of our County Court to be held at dividing Creek in Somerset County aforesaid the third next (day)
