Therefore it is Considered by the Justices here the same day and year last mentioned that the Said sum of Nine Shillings and two pence part of the sum so attached and confined be confined in the hands of the Said Charles Ramsey as of the lights and credits of the said William Gilchrist towards satisfying unto the Said John Scarbrough as well the sum of three pounds Current money and four hundred pounds of tobacco as also the costs amounting upon the afo^d Writ of attachment. and that the Said John Scarbrough have his Execution thereof against the Said Charles Ramsey according to act of assembly &c

Memorandum. The debts by George Bassett his attorney sued out his said Maj: Writ of Service as
the debt the tenour of which Writ follows in these words viz
Somersett County vs. Charles absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Province of Maryland and a certain
Lord Baron of Baltimore & to the Sherif of Somersett County greeting Whereas a certain John Watt of Somersett
County Esqre late in the County Court of Somersett to wit the twenty first day of November One thousand Seven
hundred and eighteen before the Worshipfull Charles Ballard Sheriff and his associate Non Justices of our said Court
and by consideration of the same Court at dividing Recd recovered against a certain Thomas Goddard of Slagway Parish
in Somersett County Taylor as well the sum of fifteen thousand pounds of tobacco aforesaid as also the sum of three
hundred and fifty one pounds of tobacco for said Land out and Expended whereof he is now in arrears and doth
not pay the same to us or to the said Court remaining before the Justices thereof manifestly appear and forasmuch as Execution remaineth
upon the same as yet to be done and because we will that those things which in our said Court are lightly done
as acknowledged should be brought to due Execution and the said John Watt being since dead who died Intestate
after said death administration of all and singular the goods Chattels lights and Credits of the said Jas.
Watt died leaving his wife was legally committed and whereas the said Ann after the administration aforesaid to her committed
is since Intermarried to a certain Thomas Collier of the County aforesaid by Intimation we have had; and forasmuch as the
debt and Costs aforesaid are yet remaneth unpaid and unsatisfied We therefore command you that by good and Lawfull
men of your Bailiwick you make known unto the said Thomas Goddard if he shall be found in your Bailiwick that
he be and appear before the Justices of our County Court to be held at dividing Recd in Somersett County aforesaid the third day
