Came before us Charles Ballard and William Stoughton Gentlemen two of his Lordships, the Lord Proprietaries Justices of the Peace of the County aff^t to keep aforesaid, and acknowledged themselves severally to be Indebted to the said Lord Proprietor in fifty pounds of good and lawfull money of great Brittain of their goods, and Chattel Lands and tenements severally to be levied for the use of his said Lord Proprietary his heirs and Successors if default be made in the condition below written

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Mary Cavanough shall personally appear at the next Court of the County aff^t to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August instant and do then and there answer unto all such matters and things which be objected against her being suspected offensively stealing divers goods from Merrick Ellis and do not depart without leave of the Court then this recognizance to be void &c - Charles Ballard, Willm. Stoughton

Now here at this day to wit the twentieth day of August and anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and twenty three appears here in Court the said Mary Cavanough in her proper person, who is discharged from the recognizance aff^t & Whereupon the said Mary Cavanough is ordered by the Court to give new recognizance for her appearance at next Court

Whereupon a certain Joseph Gray of Somerset County Gentleman here in Court acknowledged himself to owe and stand justly indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietarie his heirs and Successors in the sum of fifty pounds Current money of Maryland to be levied on his Body goods or Chattel Land, or tenement for the use of his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary, In case the said Mary Cavanough do not make her personal appearance before the Justices of the County Court to be held at Dividing Creek in Somerset County aff^t the third Tuesday of November next to answer unto his said Lordship concerning all such matters and things as shall be then and there objected against her on his said Lordships Behalf and to stand abide the Judgment of the Court thereon and not to depart the same Court without License thereof, then the above recognizance to be void otherwise &
