Thomas Walker - Ordered by the Court that Thomas Walker give recognizance in twenty pounds Court money for his appearance at November Court next and give such Evidence as he Knows against Mary Cavanough Sarah Walker and Susannah Walker, and not to depart the same Court without License there of - Thereupon the said Thomas Walker present here in Court acknowledged himself to owe and stand fully indebted unto his Lordship the right honorable the Lord Proprietarie in the Sum of twenty pounds Court money to be levied on his Body goods or Chattels Lands or tenements for the Use of his said Lordship the Lord Proprietarie his heirs and Successors, in Case he do not make his personall appearance before the Justices of Our County Court to be held at Dividing Creek in Somerset County after the third Tuesday of August November next, and then and there give such Evidence as he shall Know against Mary Cavanough Sarah Walker and Susannah Walker, and Mary Walker of and Concerning their feloniously Stealing ^{the} ~~the~~ goods of Merrick Ellis and John Banister and not depart the same Court without License there of then the above recognizance to be void &

Ordered by the Court that Thomas Walker of Tomsett County Gauch deliver upon unto Mary Cavanough his late Servant all her wearing Cloaths and other goods that is to say, ten yards of worsted Stuff, a pair of Slaves and two Wascots &

William Young - Memorandum that this day to with the first day of August One thousand seven hundred and twenty three came before me John Handy one of his Lordships the Lord Proprietaries Justices of the Peace for Somerset County William Young with his Security John Goshin and did acknowledge himself to be indebted unto his said Lordship for the Sum of ten pounds Sterling Cash to be levied on their goods and Chattels Lands or tenements for the Use of his said Lordship if he fail in the Condition hereafter mentioned - The Condition of the above recognizance is such that if William Young aft doe of the year and good Behaviour to all his Majesties good Subjects of this province and especially to John Huffington of Somerset County and make his personall appearance before the Justices of Peace for the County aft in Court sitting to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August Instant to answer what shall be objected against him on his Lordships Behalfe and stand and abide the Judgment of the Court then this recognizance to be void - He to be and remain in full force and vertue in Law & John Handy

Now here at this day to with the the twentieth day of August and Year One thousand seven hundred and twenty three personally appeared herein Court the aft William Young and prays that his appearance may be Entered to save himselfe and Security from the above recognizance of Bail so as aft Entered into thereupon the said William Young's appearance is Entered, and he and his Security accordingly discharged &

Where as several Summons hath Issued Out of this Court against a certain Mary Emis to appear before this Court to give Evidence on Behalfe of the Lord Proprietary, and for as much as the said Mary Emis is since Married to a certain Benjamin Full she would not Obey the said Except - whereupon at the Motion of Mr. James Crook - Justices thereof - the Court is Ordered by the Court that Summons Issued against the said Mary Emis by the Name of Mary Emis alias Full &
