memorandum the fifth Sued Out his Lordships writ of attachment against the deft the tenor
of this follows in these words vizd: Dorchester County vs: Charles absolute Lord and
Proprietarie of the Province of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore & to the Sher.

Dorchester County Greeting we command you that you attach any the good, Chattels, lights or credits of William Kenney
if they shall be found in your Bailiwick to the value of eight thousand pounds of tobacco and when you have the same
attached or any part thereof of the same in your custody safe keep so that you have the same before the Justices of our said
Court to be held at the town of Cambridge the Second Tuesday of June next Year and there to be condemned according to act
of assembly to and for the use of the same Thomas Howell unsel the said William Kenney by himself or his attorney shall
appear and answer unto the said Thomas Howell in a clear & free way on the cause according to Law and that by good
and lawfull men of your Bailiwick you make known unto the person or persons in whose hands you make the same
attachment that he she or they be and appear before the Justices of our said Court to be held as aforesaid to show cause if any
she or they have why the same good, Chattels, lights or credits so attached in his her or their hands ought not to be
condemned and Execution thereof had and made according to the form of the act of assembly in that case made and provided
if he she or they it shall seem meet and how you shall execute this writt that you make known unto our said
Justices at the day and place aforesaid and have you then and there this Writ Witness Jacob Loockerman Esq: B: Chie Justic
of our said Court the Sixteenth day of March in the Eighty year of Our Dominion & anno 1722 -

At which said Second Tuesday of June to wit the Eleventh day of the same Month and Day One thousand Seven
hundred and twenty three being the day of the return of the said Writ Comette the Thomas Howell by Francis Allen his
attorney and the Sher. of Dorchester County to whom the foregoing writ was directed Likewise Comette and made to witness -
Whereof to the Court here endorsed in these words following vizd. To the worshipfull Justices within Mentioned I humbly
Certifie that by vertue of the Writ to me directed I have attached in the hands of William Compton five Sheeys of
the value of two hundred pounds of tobacco, in the hands Charles Smith Nine hundred pounds of tobacco, in the hands of
John Adams ten Shillings, and ten Bushells of Indian Corn of the value of three hundred & twenty pounds of tobacco in
the hands of Thomas Howell, five hundred pounds of tobacco in the hands of Sarah Hinde five hundred pounds of
tobacco and in the hands of Thomas Howell One pound eleven Shillings of the value of three hundred and seventy
two pounds of tobacco, and further that I have made known unto the several persons in whose hands I have made the
same attachments that they be and appear at the time and place within contained to shew Cause & before John Euston
and John Doe good and lawfull men of my Bailiwick as by the within Writ is commanded to aforesaid.
